

CREATIVE TEAM

Dr. Jason Hiester (Artistic Director & Conductor) performs professionally on both sides of the baton. As a conductor Dr. Hiester was assistant conductor of Opera Columbus for five seasons and is currently artistic director of Converging Arts Columbus, and conductor for the Sacred Music Institute of America. As a vocalist his credits include roles with West Palm Beach Opera, Utah Festival Opera, Cincinnati Opera, Columbus Opera, ProMusica Chamber Orchestra, FloridaGrand Opera and concert work with Miami Bach Society, Musica Sacra of Cincinnati, Northern Kentucky Symphony, Columbus Bach Ensemble, Columbus Dance Theater, Central Ohio Symphony Orchestra, Vocal Arts Ensemble of Cincinnati, Springfield Symphony, and Vocal Arts Ensemble of Springfield. He was a winner of both the Schloss Leopoldskron competition in Salzburg, Austria and the West Palm Beach Opera Competition. Locally, he is Associate Professor Music at Ohio Wesleyan University and organist at Powell United Methodist church.

Jamie Kotrba (Choreographer)

Jaime Kotrba is currently the Executive Director at Columbus Dance Theatre where she produces, choreographs and teaches for the professional company and school. Jaime grew up in Northern Michigan and graduated from Interlochen Arts Academy as a dance major under the direction of Sharon Randolph. She attended the Dance Theatre of Harlem School before joining the second company and later the main company dancing work nationally and internationally by George Balanchine, John Taras, Michael Smuin and Geoffrey Holder, to name a few. She has had the pleasure of performing in theaters around the world including State Theatre in New York City, Sadler's Wells Theater in London, England, in the Bermuda Arts Festival and in 2006, at the White House for President George W. Bush, honoring Dance Theatre of Harlem's late Artistic Director, Arthur Mitchell.

In 2006, Jaime helped found the Janusphere Dance Company in New York City, where she choreographed a work that premiered in Santa Barbara, California. In 2007, she joined BalletMet Columbus and enjoyed dancing works by Gerard Charles, David Nixon and many others. She has been a guest artist with Les Grands Ballet Canadiens' production of The Nutcracker, Viewpoint Dance in New York City, and Collage Dance Collective in Memphis, Tennessee. With Collage, she also had the joy of performing in Port Au Prince, Haiti with Ballet D'Afric Du Haiti.

Jaime has enjoyed being a guest teacher and choreographer for various studios in New York and Michigan and has had the honor of receiving the Greater Columbus Arts Council's Choreography Fellowship in 2011. **Rebecca Larkin (Composer)** is a musical storyteller. As a composer and flutist, her music conveys an unraveling narrative that she and her audience can interpret in any way they wish. Inspired by soundtracks and concert music alike, Rebecca writes visual music for the stage and screen. She has been named a finalist for the ASCAP Morton Gould Young Composer awards and a scholar for the Game Audio Network Guild (GANG). She is an enthusiastic collaborator and constantly seeks opportunities to create new cross-disciplinary work. Rebecca received her B.M. Flute Performance degree from Ohio Wesleyan University where she studied flute with Nancy Gamso and Randall Hester and composition with Jennifer Jolley and Clint Needham. She earned her M.M. Composition degree from the University of Oregon where she studied composition with Robert Kyr and David Crumb and flute with Molly Barth. When Rebecca is not composing or performing, she is an avid gamer and spends quality time with her rabbit, Oreo.

Joshua W. Martin (Filmmaker & Projections Designer) is a North Carolina native and a graduate of Ohio Wesleyan University, with a degree in Theatre & Performance, Film & Media Studies, Sociology & Anthropology, and a concentration in Peace & Conflict studies. As a first-generation theatre artist and maker, Josh has spent the last decade cultivating a career in the performing arts working and designing in with Theatre in the Park, Burning Coal Theatre, Women's Theatre Festival, Imperium Theatre Company, CAM Raleigh, NC Governor's School, and nationally with notable work for La Mama Experimental Theatre, Columbus School for Girls, Converging Arts, Ohio Wesleyan Drama, OWU Opera, Zenon Dance, American Dance Festival, and for independent artists Ryan J. He became a full time student at Columbus Dance Theatre at the age of 19. Brennan was promoted to a Trainee position in the following year, and then accepted an Apprentice position with the Company the next year. During his time with Columbus Dance Theatre, Brennan had the opportunity to work alongside with and learn from many amazing local and out of state artists and choreographers. Brennan is thrilled to return for the new season as a Company dancer and Young Children's Division Instructor with Columbus Dance Theatre.

Michael Kirkman (Chorus) is well known to Columbus audiences as both a soloist and ensemble singer.
